He recommends that the contract for the improvement of Abbott, Lumber, Dupont and Beatty Streets be awarded to Messrs Boyd & Landermin; Carroll Street Approach to Angus McCallow and Carsthal's house to W. J. Heatley.

2. That the City Director be instructed, to prepare amendment to Street By-law to allow 16 lanes around Belmont Court.

5. That the Sidewalk be constructed 8 feet from the Sideroad instead of 9 feet as it now is.

6. That tenders be called for the grading of the following streets 20 feet wide:-

Smith Street from Cambel to Homer;

Homer Street from Smith to Nelson;

Nelson Street from Homer to Barrard;

Barrard from end to end,

Thurlow, Jarvis and Nicola from end to end,

Nelson and Danie from Barrard to Nicola,

Everleigh Street from end to end;

Seventh Avenue from Westminster Avenue easterly to Block 100, then north to Block 93,

Sixth Avenue from Westminster Avenue easterly to Block 85 and

Fifth Avenue from Westminster Av. to Block 93,

Sixth Avenue westerly from Westminster Avenue to the creek running from the Brewery or to the western boundary of Block 12, District Lot 302, and

Market Street from Sixth Avenue South to Block 39,

7. That tenders be called for the laying of an eight-foot sidewalk on the west side of Granville Street from Hastings to Gordon Street.

8. That the Chairman of the S. & W. Committee purchase a cart, harness and bait for flushing the sewers as previously recommended.

9. That the local Harbour Bridge be constructed from the foot of Georgia Street

as shown on the plan, this amount
the necessity of purchasing Lot 14,
That the Health Inspector be in-
structed to exercise more stringent
measures to prevent people from
throwing slops, refuse and garbage
into the street gutters and also prevent
potholes from connecting closets with
surface drains.

8. That the City Engineer be empowered
to repair streets and sidewalks where
deemed necessary and to examine
and report upon the straightening of
Powell Street east of Campbell Avenue
and the continuation of the sidewalk
on the South Side of Powell Street.

Regarding the offer of Mr. E. J. Blair of
Toronto we would deem it worthy of
consideration if he would deed some
acres of land to the City for the purpose
set forth in his communication but
we would not recommend the making
of any permanent improvements under
a lease.

That as the 1st of July is our fiscal year it would be well that a substantial acknowledgment should be made to the Fire Brigade in recognition of their valuable services to this City, seeing that they are wholly a volunteer Company, and we would therefore move that the Council vote them \$200⁰⁰ to be spent as they see fit.
