MINUTES

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Vancouver May 14th 1888

The Council met on Monday May 14th 1888 at 7:30 P. M.

Present His Worship Mayor Oppenheimer, Aldermen Alexander, Bell-Irving, Brighthouse, Clark, Dougall, Humphries and Oppenheimer.

The Minutes of last meeting were read and adopted.

Communications

From City Treasurer regarding instructions re accepting a draft in payment of Hose Reels.

From A. G. Ferguson asking leave to withdraw his petition asking for a franchise to run street railways.

From H. Abbott informing Council that the Sunday Train Service would be resumed on the 20th inst. Filed.

From McGirr and McKinnon drawing the attention of Council to some needed repairs in the vicinity of the Sunnyside Hotel. Referred to the Board of Works.

From A. G. Harvey Secretary of the Foot Ball Club asking that Council grant 10 acres of the Government Reserve at Brockton Point for Recreation Grounds.

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From A. H. B. McGowan, Secretary of the Board of Trade enclosing a resolution on the question of granting franchises to street railways. Filed.

From the Special Committee on Street Railway By-Law, giving their report and begging to be discharged. Filed.

(3) That the Chairman of the Board ascertain the cost of inaugurating a night telephone service and report fully to Council, also that he inquire as to the cost of getting a supply of coal for the fire hall.

(4) That Thomas Simpson's Salary be increased to \$60.00 per month to date from the 1st of June.

(5) That tenders be invited for the supplying of feed for the fire engine team for three months.

(6) That the Fire Inspector be instructed to cause all premises to be cleared of rubbish etc. and that the land approaches be placed in proper condition.

That the Board of Works be empowered to repair Westminster Road within the City limits. Carried. Moved by Alderman Bell-Irving seconded by Alderman Brighthouse.

That the Street Inspector Mr. Huntly, be instructed to collect 25 cents from the owners of every building on which a street number has been placed according to the provisions of the By-Law. Carried.

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Moved by Alderman Alexander seconded by Alderman Bell-Irving.

That the City Solicitor be instructed to consider the best mode of giving the Athletic Association Control of 10 or more acres of the Park for the Special purposes of the Association. Carried. Moved by Alderman Bell-Irving seconded by Alderman Brighthouse.

That the Finance Committee be instructed to consider the advisability of increasing the Salary of the City Engineer. Carried. Moved by Alderman Oppenheimer seconded by Alderman Bell-Irving.

That the Board of Works be instructed to consider the prayer of Messrs McGirr and McKinnon asking that the space on the Street between the approach to the City Wharf and the Sunnyside Hotel be cleansed and covered in and if deemed advisable to have the work done. Carried. Moved by Alderman Clark seconded by Alderman Humphries.

That tenders be called for the grading and planking or gravelling of the lane running from Powell Street to Oppenheimer Street between Columbia Avenue and Carroll Street. Carried.

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Notice of Motion.

Alderman Humphries gave notice that he would at next meeting of Council introduce a motion to call for tenders for the privilege of constructing street railways in the City of Vancouver.

The Council then adjourned.
