The Board of Boards met on Thursday, April 25<sup>th</sup> 1889.

Present Aldermen Dugliss, McConnell and Appenheimer.

- 1 That: Strasser be allowed 15c per cubic yard for filling in Georgia St. for about 120 cubic yards.
- 2 That: the Contractor employed by the Lower Street Railway Company, for the clearing etc of Block 7, 200 to be allowed the same rate for clearing, burning and close gutting the streets fronting on said block and that he paid for the same when there are funds available for the purpose. Estimated cost \$64<sup>00</sup>
- 3 That Seymour Street between Drade and Davis Streets be graded before the sidewalk is laid, estimated cost \$15<sup>00</sup>
- 4 That Pennell Street at the crossing of Campbell Avenue be cut down to grade estimated cost \$30<sup>00</sup>
- 5 That A. Dunder's offer to put in two drains on Drade Street and fill up the Street to grade be not entertained, as there are no funds available for carrying out the work.
