The Board of Bonds met on Thursday, May
9th 1889.

Present: Aldermen Dryhouse, Thorne,
and McConnell.

we beg to recommend: -

- 1 That John Cartwright's offer to construct a sidewalk in front of his hotel on Campbell Avenue be accepted, and that he be refunded the cost thereof when there are funds on hand for the purpose.
- 2 That Seymour Street between Davis and Smith Streets be graded full width, and a sidewalk laid thereon six feet wide and that the work be proceeded with at once estimated cost \$1560⁰⁰
- 3 That Princess Street between Carl Avenue and Banks Avenue be graded full width.
- 4 That J. M. Lafere be permitted to move a building situated on the corner of Hastings and Seymour Streets to a point with out the fire limits.
- 5 That the 10 ft plank roadway on Bender Street between Howe Street and the Stable be lifted and laid on the east side of Burrard Street for a sidewalk commencing at Dunsen Street and running north as far as Hastings Street to make a continuous sidewalk from Dunsen Street to Hastings Street and that Bender Street be gravelled.
- 6 That the waste earth at the South end of Dunbar Avenue be used to grade

Westminster Avenue between Pine Street and Gate Creek Bridge.

7 That Cambie Street between Hostings and Water Streets be gravelled and that Thomas, Seymour and Richards Streets be gravelled from Hostings to Cordova and that part of Drake Street be filled by excavation made by contractor under.

8 That Street Crossings be put down at the crossing of Georgia and Seymour Streets and at the corner of Georgia and Richards Streets.

9 That plans and Specifications for a Fountain be called for to be placed at the corner of Hostings and Barrall Streets Cost not to exceed \$2000⁰⁰
