A Special Meeting of the Council was held on Monday March 17<sup>th</sup> 1890 at 3 P.M. to consider the applications for the position of Police Magistrate  
Present His Worship, the Mayor and full Board of Aldermen  
Moved by Alderman Bowie  
Seconded by " Costello

That the Selection of Police Magistrate be made by ballot; carried.

The Council then proceeded to a ballot, and after the third round Mr. Isaac N. Balliett was found to have a majority of the Council.

It was then moved by Alderman Bowie  
Seconded by Alderman Suttell

That Isaac N. Balliett be appointed Police Magistrate at a Salary of \$1500<sup>00</sup> a year on the conditions that he shall not begin or carry on any law practice nor enter into legal partnership, but that he be allowed to hold consultations where the City is in no wise interested"

Moved in Amendment by Alderman Cox  
Seconded by Alderman Costello

That the Salary be fixed at \$1200<sup>00</sup> a year with the same conditions attached

Amendment lost; motion carried
