Whereas it is necessary and expedient that a wharf or wharves should be erected as soon as possible on the shores of Coal harbor and Burrard Inlet north of the boundary of the City of Vancouver under the control of the Corporation of said City.

And whereas in consequence of the present financial state of said Corporation it is not considered judicious for said Corporation to attempt the construction of any wharf or wharves at as early a period as the public necessity demands same.

And whereas David Oppenheimer of said City of Vancouver has applied for permission to build a wharf and an approach to a wharf proposed to be erected by him on the Northern extremity of Cadwell Street in said City which permission was granted to him his heirs and assigns by resolution of this Council dated August 28th 1886 and confirmed by By-Law No 15 subject to the conditions in said resolution and by-law contained.

And whereas said David Oppenheimer has also applied to the Governor in Council for permission to build a wharf at the Northern extremity of said wharf and an approach to a wharf and extending easterly therefrom about five hundred feet notice of which application appeared in the Canada Gazette bearing date September 18th A.D. 1886

And whereas said

David Oppenheimer has also applied to the Governor in Council for permission to build by Company and bearing date October 14th A. D. 1886 has transferred all his right title and interest in the privileges granted or to be granted to him by said resolution and said by law and under and by virtue of said application to the Governor in Council to the Vancouver Wharfage and Storage Company (limited liability) whom he has also nominated his attorney and granted the use of the name of him the said Oppenheimer in continuing said application if said Company desire so to do.

And whereas said Company have entered into an agreement with the Corporation of the City of Vancouver to convey to said Corporation said wharves and approach upon terms mentioned and set out in said agreement.

Be it therefore resolved by the Mayor and Aldermen of the City of Vancouver in Council assembled,

that the construction of the public wharf and approach thereto application for permission to construct which and approach of the said wharf has been made to the Governor in Council by David Oppenheimer as appears by the notice given by him in the Canada Gazette bearing date September 18th A. D. 1886 is a ne-
cessary
